REQUIREMENTS

You must be

- A staff member of St Hild's, either employed by the Trust or a contractor
- Committed to all children in your community receiving the best possible education
- Able to work as part of a team

COMMITMENTS OF THE ROLE

- The Local Governing Committee meets 6 times a year, after school
- In between meetings, LGC members visit school during the day to see the school in action and report back what they find
- You will be appointed for four years (although you can resign at any time)

THE LGC WORK TOGETHER TO

- Get to know the school well and visit to find out more
- Support and challenge the Headteacher and staff to continuously improve the school
- See the big picture we don't get involved in the operational day-today running of the school, but rather the strategy

HOW WE WILL SUPPORT YOU

- We will provide an induction to your role as a LGC member
- You will have access to training to develop your knowledge and skills through online platforms and a CPD programme
- An experienced member of the LGC will be your 'buddy' to work alongside you and answer questions

Nomination of Staff Member of the Local Governing Committee of St Hild's Church of England School

I am writing to invite you to nominate yourself as a staff member of the Local Governing Committee (LGC) for our school. We have one staff member on the LGC and this position is currently vacant.

Each of the seven schools within NEAT Academy Trust has its own (LGC), which reports to the Trust's Board of Directors. It is important for the LGC to have a diverse range of people who bring different skills, experiences and views but who are all committed to the future success of our school and all of its pupils.

Being a Local Governing Committee member

The role description sets out what is expected of LGC members and the Trust will provide induction and continuing professional development to support you in the role.

Nomination Process

Nominations must be from a member staff who meets one of the following criteria:

- a NEAT employee whose contract of employment requires them to work solely at this school or at more than one school within NEAT including this school (excluding members of the NEAT central team who may be required to work at any school in the trust);
- a member of staff engaged by a contractor to work solely at this school or at more than one school including this school on a regular basis, regardless of whether the other school(s) are in NEAT; or
- engaged by the school on a self-employed basis to work wholly or partly at the school on a regular basis.

Election process

If the number of nominations is equal to or fewer than the number of vacancies, then all those nominated will be elected unopposed.

If there are more nominations than vacancies an election will be held by secret ballot. If that is necessary, voting papers - including the supporting statement submitted by each nominee - will be sent to all relevant staff together with details of the ballot procedure.

If no nominations are received, the election process will be restarted and nominations sought from those eligible on the new closing date for nominations.

Staff will be notified of the outcome of the process by email from Natalie Barnes in due course and will also be discussed at staff briefing.

I would like to encourage you to consider becoming a Local Governing Committee member and take an active role in shaping our future as a school within the local community.
